The qualifications are simply to be of good character and be a lineal descendant of a Patriot who served the cause of American


independence during the

The importance of the Presidency of the United States has dramatically increased since George Washington, our first President. We would like to think that the patriotic ideals and declared goals of the Society had some influence on the decisions these Presidents

made. Since our founding, in 1875, seventeen Presidents of the United States have been or are members of the SAR. Unfortunately, as a Society we have no provisions for honorary membership, hence Presidents John F. Kennedy and Ronald W. Reagan who did not have the necessary Revolutionary War ancestry to attain SAR membership were not eligible.
