The National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution (NSSAR) is a historical, education and patriotic organization formed in 1889 and chartered by the United States Congress in 1906. The purpose of the SAR is: "... to perpetuate the memory of those who, by their services or sacrifices during the war of the American Revolution, achieved the independence of the American People. A Primary Objective of the SAR is:"...to support excellence in teaching of American history."

SAR has approximately 30,000 members living in all 50 states and 23 foreign countries. NSSAR charters State 'Societies' such as the California Society Sons of the American Revolution, and those State Societies establish Chapters within their boundaries. There are currently 26 SAR chapters in California, evenly divided between Northern and Southern California.
