Presidents Message

Compatriots,

Thank you for the opportunity to serve as your President of the California Society of the Sons of the American Revolution. I did not expect to be in this position at this time, but Past President Craig Anderson's resignation due to health issues resulted in my promotion. Please join me in wishing him a full recovery. I am optimistic that we can emerge from the challenges of the past few years and grow our Society stronger than ever.



As I stated at the recent CASSAR Board of Managers meeting, I want to share with you four words that summarize my vision for the next year. I will discuss two of the words this month and the other two words next month.

The first word is Inspiration.

What inspires you to do what you do? What inspires us to be in the SAR? Like many of you I am inspired by our patriot ancestors. They were farmers, shop keepers, and tradesmen, and they decided to take on the largest army in the world. What were they thinking? Some have called it the Glorious Cause, some have called it a Miracle, but after 8 years on the battlefields, our ancestors won. They wanted liberty and freedom so much that they risked everything. They inspire me by their courage and perseverance.

Moving to the present, I'm also inspired by the youth that participate in our SAR programs. One of my favorite events at our SAR Annual Congress is the High School Orations Contest Finals. It's also inspiring to see the elementary school students who participate in our poster contest, the middle school students who participate in our brochure contest, the high school students who write essays, and the Eagle Scouts, JROTC Cadets and Sea Scouts who earn SAR Awards. All of these young people have learned more about American history and the founding or our country by participating in our SAR Youth Programs.

These are two examples. You may be inspired by these and other activities in the SAR.

The second word is Involvement.

When we are inspired by something or someone in an organization, most of us want to get involved. The fact that you are reading this indicates you already are involved in the SAR, and many of you are leaders in the SAR. When you think about what inspires you, then, think about how you can get others involved. I mentioned the youth contests, but maybe others are inspired by wearing the uniform of our ancestors and participating in the color guard at

patriotic events. Maybe they are inspired to honor our patriot ancestors by serving as a chapter registrar and helping new members complete their applications. Maybe they can share their skills with the SAR by serving as a chapter secretary or treasurer. Maybe they want to serve as a Chapter President or as a State officer or in a position at the National Society. We need for everyone to find what inspires them and then get involved.

I believe these two words, Inspiration and Involvement, are a way we can continue growing our Society and increase our presence in our communities as we approach the 250th Anniversary of our nation's independence. With all of us working together we can find what inspires us and help our members get involved.

Fire Safety Commendation Medal

Fire Chief Marshall Turbeville, Northern Sonoma County Fire Protection District. Chief Turbeville led his community's response to the devastating wildfires in California over the last several years, including the Tubbs, Pocket, Kincade, and Wallbridge fires. These events not only caused widespread damage and destruction, but they also triggered significant emotional and psychological trauma within the community and the fire department. After frontline experience fighting these fires, Chief Turbeville determined the status quo response to the firestorms was inadequate and worked with his community to develop new



strategies focused on prevention, preparedness, and appropriate mitigation methods to save future life, property, and the environment.

Law Enforcement Medal

William E. Nay is a Marine having served 1967-1977 as an MP and Criminal Investigator. While working at the University of California Livermore Police Department he earned both his BS and MS Degrees in Criminal Justice. At San Jose State University he reactivated the lota Chapter of Alpha Phi Sigma, the National Criminal Justice Honor Society and has remained active for 40 years. He was a National Security analyst in the U. S. Department of Energy. Retiring in 2005 he continued to perform duties as a National Security Consultant. He continues to mentor criminal justice students in Alpha Phi Sigma.

Harbor Chapter Celebrates Navy's 247 Birthday

The Harbor Chapter hosted a dinner event and patriotic celebration of the United States Navy's 247 birthday on October 13 on board the Battleship USS IOWA.

The USS IOWA served our country proudly in WWII, Korea, and the Cold War. Today the historic U.S. Navy Ship is an iconic Los Angeles landmark and considered one of the region's best outdoor museums for families and visitors of all ages.

Color guard representatives were present from Harbor, Orange, and San Diego County chapters as they mustered in the USS Iowa Officers' Wardroom.





The highlight of the evening was the recognition of World War II veteran, William Dillion, who was the radio and radar operator on the USS Sailfish that sank the Japanese Aircraft Carrier Chuyo during a typhoon.

The Chuyo was the only aircraft carrier sunk by allied forces during WWII.

Retired Army Col. Darryl Hensley, who received the Bronze Star for his service in Afghanistan in 2003, was also formally recognized.

David Canfield, vice president and chief information officer for the Iowa Foundation, spoke on the years he served on the ship and its coming to transformation as the National Museum of the Surface Navy. Vice President South, John Ferris also received a certificate of appreciation for his contributions to encourage promotion of America 250 in the California Society and at the chapter level.

Harbor President, James Bunker, in keeping with the evening's theme, gave an America 250 presentation on the formation of the Continental Navy and the struggles they faced during the Revolutionary War.

Turnout for the event was excellent with 43 chapter members and guests in attendance including the Western District Vice President General, Derek Brown and several regents from local DAR chapters.
