2013 Membership Drops and Reinstatements





The Fund is invested with Morgan Stanley Smith Barney (MSSB) in account Number 244–022510–0–021, an MSSB Lm ("house-holding") fund, i.e., the individual CASSAR funds are held in one account though each is managed separately. The sub-funds are use dedicated and are: Education Fund, Congress Fund and Permanent Fund.

California Compatriot Editor Report for 2013-2014

At the 2013 BOM Meeting it was decided that the next issue of the *California Compatriot* would be the last issue to be printed and mailed to all members, and that a subscription fee of \$5 for two issues annually would be assessed for those who desired a printed black-and-white copy delivered by USPS. All members would be able to access a color version online on the CASSAR website. The 2014 proposed budget for the *California Compatriot* was reduced to \$900 for the setup of three (3) final PDF color issues of the *Compatriot* which would be used for the online issue, or for submission to a printing/mailing facility for delivery to those who subscribed to the PDF black-and-white version. There would be a Spring issue following the Annual CASSAR Meeting in April, a Congress edition following the National Congress in July (online only) which contains information about the NSSAR National Congress, and a Winter issue following the November BOM Meeting. USPS delivery would only be made for the Spring and Winter issues, but not the Congress issue. A new revenue line item of \$1000 was created for the subscription income which would be used as the offset for the printing a mailing costs of an estimated 200 subscribers at \$5 each. A new expense line item with the same amount was created to pass-through the subscription income.

In accordance with the actions taken at the 2013 BOM Meeting, the spring 2013 issue of the Compatriot was printed and mailed to all active members of the CASSAR. The Congress issue was published online only, and since I was able to put most of the pages together without the support of the setup company, we were only charged \$40 for the setup of a limited number of pages that were merged with the pages I setup. The Winter 2014 issue was setup in January and the cost was \$300 which came out of the 2014 budget. The CASSAR Secretary reported that only 21 members paid a subscription fee of \$5 for USPS delivery of the Compatriot. Thus the subscription line items for revenue and costs of the printing and mailing came to \$105 for the year. The actual printing and mailing cost of the Winter issue for those 21 members came to a total of \$34.47 leaving \$70.53 for the remainder of the year.

Color Guard Commander Annual Report

For January 1, 2013 to December 31, 2013

Reporting Period: January 1, 2013 to December 31, 2013

The position of Color Guard Commander for the California Society of the Sons of the American Revolution remains the coordination of programs requiring the participation of color guardsmen at CASSAR activities and leading the guardsmen during those events.

CASSAR Chapter Color Guard units:

During 2012 CASSAR compatriots of the various chapter color guards were identified and their names compiled on a roster including their chapter affiliation and email address. This roster allows neighboring chapters to combine forces for participation in large color guard events and fosters improved communication between the CASSAR Color Guard Commander and the chapter color guard members as well as between the various chapter color guard units. Currently there are almost seventy members of the CASSAR Color Guard. The CASSAR Color Guard is comprised of compatriots from about twenty chapters.

CASSAR Website Color Guard page:

In 2013 a color guard page on the CASSAR website updated. The objective is to publish news and information concerning past, present and coming activities of the CASSAR Color Guard and local chapter color guard units. The page contains useful information for CASSAR guardsmen including a link to the NSSAR Color Guard Handbook, the CASSAR Color Guard Activity Contest Report, and the qualifications for the NSSAR bronze, silver and gold color guard medals and the CASSAR bronze, silver and gold Major General Baron von Steuben color guard medals and of course photographs of color guardsmen in action.

The CASSAR Color Guard participation in significant events:

CASSAR Color Guardsmen participated in the spring and fall CASSAR meetings in Ventura and El Segundo, Congress in Kansas City, MO and spring and fall Leadership meetings in Louisville, KY.

In February twenty-six compatriots participated in a joint SAR Color Guard during the 31st Massing of the Colors and Salute to Our Armed Forces on Sunday, February 17, 2013. Representatives from eight CASSAR Chapters as well as color guardsmen from the Arizona Society (George Lipphardt), Florida Society (Lindsey Brock), Georgia Society (J. Michael Tomme) and Virginia Society (Joseph Dooley) attended. More than a dozen women of the SAR Ladies Auxiliary, as well as ladies and children of the DAR and CAR wore Colonial Era attire. Massing of the Colors and Salute to Our Armed Forces is a NSSAR national color guard event.

In May a joint CASSAR Color Guard comprised of compatriots from the Harbor, Orange County and Silicon Valley Chapters presented and retired the Colors for the final Memorial Day program at the Crystal Cathedral in Garden Grove, CA.

In May a joint CASSAR Color Guard comprised of compatriots from the General George Patton, Harbor, Orange County, Riverside and Silicon Valley Chapters presented and retired the Colors for the Field of Honor in Newport Beach, CA. The Field of Honor is a NSSAR national color guard event.

In June a joint CASSAR Color Guard comprised of compatriots from the Harbor, Orange County and Santa Barbara Chapters participated in a parade and Flag Day celebration at El Presidio de Santa Barbara State Historic Park, Santa Barbara, CA.

In June Governor Franklin Smith of the Los Angeles Colony of Mayflower Descendants presented a Certificate of Appreciation to a joint CASSAR Color Guard comprised of compatriots from the Harbor and Orange County for presenting the Colors at a Mayflower Descendants banquet aboard the Queen Mary in Long Beach, CA.

In December nine CASSAR color guard units comprised of compatriots from twelve CASSAR chapters participated in Wreaths Across America. Wreaths Across America is a NSSAR national color guard event.

Other significant events:

See attachment concerning the new NSSAR National Color Guard event; Let Freedom Ring - National Bell Ringing Ceremony. During the Color Guard Committee meeting at the 2013 Fall Leadership meeting in Louisville the committee unanimously approved the proposal by compatriot Larry R. Wood that the "Let Freedom Ring - National Bell Ringing Ceremony" be recognized as a National Color Guard Event.

In August 2013 CASSAR Color Guardsman and Harbor Chapter compatriot Karl W. Jacobs became the first CASSAR compatriot to receive the prestigious NSSAR Von Steuben Color Guard Medal. To earn the National Von Steuben Medal for <u>sustained achievement</u> in the NSSAR Color Guard, a color guardsman must serve at least five years after he has received the SAR Silver Color Guard Medal, and he must participate in at least twenty-five (25) National and/or District Color Guard events. Congratulations Karl.

The CASSAR Color Guard Commander is charged with the safe keeping of:

- 1) Nylon 4' X 6' historical CASSAR flag; replacement value \$375.00
- 1) Nylon 3' X 5' United States flag; replacement value \$52.25

- 1) 7' X 1" gold telescoping parade pole; replacement value \$59.00
- 1) 7" gold eagle flag pole ornament; replacement value \$29.95
- 2) 8 ¼" gold styrene flag pole ornaments; replace value \$8.95 ea. = \$17.90
- 4) 24 X 2 1/8" brown plastic portable floor flag stands; replacement value \$21.95 ea. = \$87.80

CASSAR Compliance Committee 2013 Annual Report

1 April, 2014

Compatriots:

This committee concerns itself with the compliance by Chapters of the California Society to the Bylaws of the California and National Societies of the Sons of the American Revolution.

FEDERAL AND STATE TAX REGULATIONS:

Every Chapter of the California Society SAR must submit Chapter Income Tax Reports to both the Federal and California State IRS. The deadline this year is May 31, 2014 for the calendar year 2013. The majority of individual CASSAR Chapters may file electronically – rather than filling out a long form. You will need your Chapter EIN number to file. This number may be obtained from our State Secretary if you do not have it. The Federal form is 990-N. If your Chapter has received income in excess of \$25,000 during the calendar year 2011 – you will need to submit the long form. If you Chapter received less than \$25,000, you may submit your Form 990-N electronically. Failure to submit annually may result in the Chapter losing its 501C3 (Non-Profit) Status. Any Chapter losing its 501C3 status will be dropped from the roles of both the California and National SAR Societies. This is a result of the Sarbanes-Oxley Act of 2002 (Pub.L. 107-204, 116 Stat. 745, enacted July 30, 2002) – also known as the "Public Company Accounting Reform and Investor Protection Act".

Every Chapter of the California Society SAR should send a copy of the confirmation of receipt for both the Federal form 990-N and the California form 199-N filings from the respective agencies to the California State SAR Secretary upon receipt of the confirmation.

CHAPTER PROPERTY

It is imperative that individual Chapters within the California Society have a listing of properties owned by the Chapter – and the location of such properties. Many Chapters own flags, uniforms, muskets, etc. They need to know where they are and who has possession of each and every item. Each Chapter is encouraged to update their list of "who, what, where" of all items within its inventory on an annual basis. The problem that we want to avoid is: If a Chapter disbands (according to CASSAR Bylaws) the California Society becomes the holder of all of the properties of that Chapter and holds it for a period of three years – and no one knows what they own and where it is – then the State Society will not be able to return it when the Chapter is reinstated. After three years, the State Society may give such items to other Chapters within the State Society or give to a New Chapter within the State Society. This also includes any financial holdings of a Chapter that has disbanded. If your Chapter does not inventory all materials originally purchased and owned by the Chapter – do so immediately. This also applies to your Chapter Treasurer. The State Society requires the Bank Account numbers of individual Chapter Checking and Savings Accounts and the location of their respective Savings Institutions.

SAR NATIONAL SOCIETY

Every Chapter Officer should go to the National Society Web Page (SAR.com) and review the responsibilities that you have in order for your Chapter to be in compliance with Federal and State

Laws, National Society SAR By-Laws, and, our California Society By-Laws. Access may be made by clicking on the COMPATRIOT tab, then clicking on the ETHICS tab. The policies are shown and explained in some length and include the following catagories:

- 1. Non-Profit Compliance Policies relating to Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Service.
- 2. Code of Business Ethics and Conduct Policy
- 3. Conflict of Interest Statement and Policy
- 4. Whistle Blower Policy
- 5. Record Retention and Destruction Policy.

Each of the above categories are explained in some detail and should be read by Chapter Officers and followed as Chapter Standard Operating Procedure.

AND....

As Chairman of the CASSAR Compliance Committee, I visit Chapters, visit their web sites, read their newsletters - looking at what they are doing, and how they are doing it. I have noticed one thing that I believe is a potential problem.

Many of our Chapters have men attending meetings on a regular basis, participating in Color Guards, or other activities of the Chapter – who are not members of the National or State Society. That is fine and we welcome one and all. However, some Chapters have designated these "non-members" as "Associate Members" or "At-Large Members", or some other word attached to the word "Member". By definition, a Member of a Chapter must first be a member of the National Society and a State Society before he may be a member of a Chapter. An approved application, along with a National Society membership number, approved by the State Society, is required before the person may join a Chapter. Only "Members" pay annual dues to National, State and Chapter and receive National, State, and Chapter publications. We all have Guests or other participants at meetings and events sponsored by our Chapters. They do not pay dues to National, State, or Chapters. They do not receive publications. Many "non-members" do participate with Chapters in Color Guards or other Chapter activities – and we welcome them.

The primary responsibility of the program chairman remains the coordination of programs for JROTC (high school level) bronze ROTC Medals and ROTC (university level) silver ROTC Medals each year and to coordinate the Enhanced JROTC Program.

There remain a few California ROTC/JROTC programs that aren't supported by a chapter. As the State Chairman, I have sent requested medals directly to those schools. In 2013 the program chairman issued bronze SAR ROTC Medals, Ribbons and Certificates to 11 JROTC programs not supported by a local CASSAR chapter, including a program in Misawa, Japan. Similarly, the program chairman issued 4 silver SAR ROTC Medals, Ribbons and Certificates to ROTC programs not supported by a local chapter.

The Enhanced JROTC Program differs from the annual awards of bronze and silver ROTC Medals. It's a contest to select the Outstanding JROTC Cadet from each Chapter and then for the State Society. The State Society's winner is submitted to the National Contest. The selection process for the Outstanding JROTC Cadet began in late 2012. The California State Society Outstanding JROTC Cadet for 2013 was Cadet Jordan Villar-Cayabyab of Vanden High School. The Air Force JROTC program was commanded by Marian R. Collins, Major, USAF (retired). Cadet Villar-Cayabyab received a State JROTC 1st Place Medallion, Ribbon & Certificate and cash award of \$750 at the Youths Awards Luncheon April 13, 2013.

Note: Cadet Gustavo Maldonado of the Sonora High School Army JROTC program in La Habra, CA earned second place during the 2012 Enhanced JROTC Program contest in California. Cadet Maldonado was accepted at the United States Military Academy (West Point). He reported to West Point in June 2013.

CASSAR Middle School Brochure Contest Report April 2014

The following is a progress report on the California Society of SAR (CASSAR) Middle School Brochure Contest as of April 2014.

In May 2009 CASSAR President Lou Carlson gave the charge to develop a middle school contest to the Youth Activities Director at the time, Tom Adams. Adams, working the Rolling Hills Middle School history teacher Kevin Tierney, conceived of the Tri-fold Brochure Contest in August. It was presented and accepted by the Executive Committee as California's new Middle School program. Wayne Griswold, then CASSAR Executive VP, presented the California proposal to the Americanism Committee in Louisville. In the fall 2009 the NSSAR Americanism Committee adopted the Middle School Brochure Contest to become the National Middle School Contest. The NSSAR Americanism Committee, along with other states, have looked to California to develop this program as a means to reach middle school children all across the nation with our patriotic message through the telling of the history of the American Revolution. The California Society should feel a sense of accomplishment and pride for the Middle School Brochure Contest became a National program this School Year 2013-14.

School Year 2010-11 was the first year CASSAR offered the Brochure Contest to the Middle School Children of California. In California, American History is taught in the 8th grade. The 8th grade could be the final grade in a traditional K-8 Elementary School, or in a typical Middle School structure 6, 7, 8, or in the middle of a Junior High School with grades 7, 8, 9. Also, each year more children in the State are being home schooled where the grade is far less structured.

This is the fourth year California will offer the Brochure Contest.

State-wide judging will occur again this year at our State Spring Meeting in April. The judging process used the last three years is a highly structured process that has been very effective. That same process with be followed again this year. Four judges are required, one each to judge: Content; Creativity; and Correctness; with a Master Judge to manage the process and tally the results of the three special area judges. This year, If possible, six judges will be used, two for each category, to improve consensus.

In this School Year 2013-14 the Middle School Brochure Contest piloted here in California for four years has become a National SAR Contest. Our California Winner will be entered in the National Contest for judging at the 124th NSSAR Congress in Greenville. SC July 18-24, 2014. California's program continues to be a pilot site for the National program, as our judging process will be adopted for use at Congress.

Senior State President, Judy Brown, for their Annual Conference in Sacramento this February, CASSAR Color Guard Commander Jim Fosdyck had North-State Unit Commander Jim Faulkinbury assembled a color guard detachment made up of Sacramento Chapter Color Guard members: Jim Faulkinbury, Russ Kaiser, Tom Chilton and Peter Hefler. 2013 was a Stellar Year for Youth Activities in the State of California. As Youth Activities Director, I attended the Spring Annual Conference in Ventura, the Fall Board of Managers Meeting in El Segundo and the 123rd SAR Annual Congress in Kansas City, Missouri.

The following areas contributed to the successes experienced over the year:

- 1. The website was maintained with appropriate updates. Thanks to Greg Hill, CASSAR webmaster, the website took on a new look in 2013 and is now more informative.
- 2. The High School Good Citizenship Award information was added to the website, thus providing an additional way to recognize youth for their Scholarship and demonstrated interest in United States History.
- 3. The Navy Sea Cadet/Navy League Sea Cadet Recognition was fully separated from ROTC/JROTC on the website for greater ease of locating information.
- 4. Support was provided to President Bigbee and President Hurst in maintaining Chairmen for each Youth Program. Additional support was provided in training and advising new chairmen.
- 5. News Articles were submitted to the California Compatriot reporting, emphasizing and encouraging the success of Youth Activities within each Chapter.
- 6. A significant emphasis was placed on strengthening the tie between CASSAR and C.A.R. This included an invitation to the C.A.R. State President to write news articles for inclusion in the California Compatriot and having a display table at the Fall and Spring State Meetings.
- 7. In support of President General Dooley's Educational Initiatives, work was done to create the CASSAR Educational Outreach School Profile when completed will be placed on the NSSAR website along with other state profiles.
- 8. Responding to the requests of the Poster Chairman and the Middle School Brochure Chairman, alternatives were explored to replace the large and costly Ribbons for State Winners in these two programs. A less expensive, and perhaps more meaningful Medallion with Ribbon will be presented in 2014 as a pilot.

- 9. "Best Practices" and increased education for State Conference Attendees were emphasized at the November 2013 Board of Managers Conference. President Hurst allocated sufficient time to permit each Youth Education and Outreach Chairman to present their programs and answer questions. Plus, the table displays brought much attention and communication among the attending compatriots.
- 10. Two significant advances were accomplished with Youth Contests in 2013. Tom Adams, Middle School Brochure Contest Chairman, worked with the NSSAR Americanism Committee to create The Sgt. Moses Adams Memorial Middle School Brochure Contest at the National level after successfully piloting the program in California. A second major accomplishment was California having its first Oration Contestant in many years. Due to the use of technology, it is hoped this program will once again become popular in California and permit us to send more students on to the National Competition
- 11. Continued efforts were made to educate CASSAR Chapters, the community and teachers regarding "The Values Through History" instructional program. With the country-wide emphasis on the Common Core Curriculum, and teachers lacking materials, this is an ideal time of presentation.

In January President Rogers presented a distinguished certificate of service to compatriot and Vice President Ray Raser (SD) for his founding, continuing support and Vice Presidency of the Eagle Chapter.

In February Wayne Rogers presented a War Service and Medal to compatriot and Eagle Scout Chairman, Frank Kebelman (ret. Lt Col. USMC).

In February compatriot and vice president Brian Bingham gave a presentation on Revolutionary Uniforms, and several members were their uniforms (Brian Bingham, Bill Bishop, Wayne Rogers and Jerry Sayre), so there was a good discussion and learning experience about revolutionary uniforms for our Chapter Color Guard. We will have a blue coat with red facing coat. Other uniforms will be accepted for activities and participation.

One of our principle efforts this past year has been obtaining a 501 c3 status

Early on we discussed 501C status and application for a Chapter Charter. Duane Wheeler indicated he would donate to help. Our initial Treasurer did not know how to file, and we had another Treasurer. We submitted and a received a federal EIN number in August. This Treasurer moved to Texas, so subsequently Wayne Rogers in October submitted EIN information charter and by laws to NSSAR and they submitted a form for our inclusion under the NSSAR 501 3 status.

A new transfer member initially considered in taking over the treasurer position but felt there may be some conflicting issues involved, and decided not to take the position.

Subsequently Wayne Rogers has indicated himself as the responsible party for the; Eagle Chapter, in place of earlier Treasurer Gordon Kelly. He has subsequently submitted a form for a change of address and responsible party to the Federal IRS.

We did receive a notice for filing form 990-N to the old address; however we got no response from Federal IRS that our letter of exemption for non-profit had been approved.

Wayne initially thought we might be fined in our state filing efforts, because of our delay in getting notice into the State of California, However, the state has indicated it will be sending us a 'FTB number' for the state. We will have this in writing in a couple of (2) weeks.

Wayne learned of the 501c3 troubles that the de Anza Trail Children of the American Revolution (CAR) who had with their 501c3 status, denied. Per their President and their CPA Treasure they were not only required to file \$100, for re-admission but were fined \$600, which took away all the money they had in their treasury.

Wayne completed and submitted an initial registration form state of California office to the Attorney General, for registry of charitable trusts, in order to have a California filing name for the Eagle Chapter, for complete other state forms (e.g. 3500A). It is said by a CASSAR attorney, that submitting for 501c3 status can cost up to \$3,000. Per Federal IRS, receiving determination of its 501c3 status or tax exemption can take up to 2-3 months. To date, it took over 4 months, without a written determination of exempt status; however by making a telephone call (recently), it was determined that the Federal IRS has determined our status as a 501 C3 in November 2013, but it has still not received our change of address yet. Currently, more work at the state of California for obtaining tax exemption is considered for address/responsible change, as well as completion of the 990 N form for 501 c3 than for Federal exemption. Wayne worked with two other SAR Chapters as well as the CASSAR and NSSAR on this tax exemption, issue for the past few months.

This endeavor has taken consideration effort and time to date. Once it is complete, our chapter will be able to do business easier. We are an inclusive genealogical society in the United States. the Eagle Chapter will be a non-profit service organization with dedicated goals and objectives in promoting patriotism, education, preserving American History, seeking to maintain and extend; the institutions of American freedom, an appreciation for true patriotism, a respect for our national symbols, and the value of American citizenship. The unifying character of *e pluribus Unum* is a force that has created from the people of many nations, one nation and one people. The Eagle Chapter's primary function is to raise funds to support the goals and objectives of the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution through community based programs and projects with local schools, military and veteran service organizations, with sufficient funds and member support. The 4th day of July holds a special place of honor and distinction for our Nation and for the Sons of the American Revolution. On July 4th 1776 the Liberty Bell was rung at Independence Hall in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, announcing the signing of the Declaration of Independence, that our people would "assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them." On July 4th 1776 our Nation was born in a single day and founded upon the principals of our inalienable God given rights. Since then every generation has celebrated the 4th of July as our Nation's birth.

On the Centennial Anniversary of our Nation's birth the Sons of the American Revolution was conceived when on the 29th day of June in 1876 an article was placed in a local San Francisco newspaper calling for "the descendants of the revolutionary fathers" to meet. This group of men, all of them descendants of the men who served in the Revolutionary War, met and on July 4th 1876 formed the Sons of the Revolutionary Sires. The Society which they formed later became the Sons of the American Revolution on 22 March 1890.

On the 26th day of June in 1963 both houses of Congress adopted Resolution Number 25 commemorating July 4th as a Day of National Celebration in recognition of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. The words of Resolution Number 25 are;

"Whereas the tolling of the Liberty Bell at Independence Hall, Philadelphia, Pa., at 2 o'clock in the afternoon of the 4th day of July, 1776, proclaimed the signing of the Declaration of Independence; and Whereas the adoption of this historic document marked the birth of our country as a free and independent nation; and

Whereas it is fitting that the anniversary of this great event should be appropriately observed in each year at the same moment throughout the United States;

Now, therefore, be it Resolved, that the Congress hereby

- (1) declares that the anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence should be observed each year by the ringing of bells throughout the United States at the hour of 2 o'clock, eastern daylight time, in the afternoon of the 4th day of July, or at such other time on that day as may be determined by local authority, and
- (2) call upon civic and other community leaders to take appropriate steps to encourage public participation in such observance."

For 50 years now Resolution Number 25 has been observed as the "Let Freedom Ring – National Bell Ringing Ceremony." This year, 2013, marks the 50th anniversary of Let Freedom Ring and to date the event has grown to over 10,000 participants all across America. Let Freedom Ring is celebrated in cities, towns, and hamlets all across America and with each passing year more communities join in the observance. Let Freedom Ring is also observed by our Military Forces, at American Military Graveyards across America and in foreign lands in honor of our fallen, and by American Merchant Marines at sea and at port.

The Sons of the American Revolution has been participating in the Let Freedom Ring for years. The Pennsylvania Society Sons of the American Revolution (PASSAR) adopted the Let Freedom Ring Ceremony in the 1960s as a worthy event to honor our ancestor's sacrifice.

The following photograph was taken during the Independence Day Luncheon at the Sheraton Philadelphia Society Hill Hotel before the Let Freedom Ring celebration and nationwide ringing of bells on the 4th of July 2006. This was the third year in a row that a President General of the SAR had attended the Let Freedom Ring celebration. The following year (2007), however, the SAR's National Congress began on July 5th in Sacramento so the President General entrusted the task to M. Hall Worthington, who was at the time a Vice President General of the SAR.

The SAR, DAR and CAR are the most important bell location recruiters along with the Boy Scouts of America, the American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Since July 4th stands as a day of prominence for America and for our Society, and since the NSSAR currently does not have a National Color Guard event honoring the birth of our Nation and the birth of our Society, and since the Let Freedom Ring – National Bell Ringing Ceremony is truly a National event celebrated all across America, and even in distant lands, like France, it is therefore fitting that the NSSAR National Color Guard Committee adopt Let Freedom Ring as a NSSAR National Color Guard Event.



GOALS

Accurate and timely tracking of our membership is the responsibility of the Registrar General. This includes recording initial accessions, deaths, transfers, and drops. My goal is to continue the work of Mike Tomme and those who preceded him. Especially in the area of recruiting, retention and reinstatements.

As a former two-term membership chairman of The American Legion in Virginia, with responsibilities similar to those of the Registrar General, I am qualified to fulfill the duties of the office i pursue. I am also a two-term Registrar of VASSAR's Col. Fielding Lewis Chapter. As Legion membership chairman in Virginia, our membership grew from 44,949 to 51,087. Although less dramatic, membership in the Col. fielding Lewis Chapter grew from 15 in 2001 to 27 in 2003. As National Vice Commander of The American Legion in 1996-97, I was primarily responsible for Recrulting, Retention and Reinstatement in Virginia. Delaware, Maryland, D. C., West Virginia, Ohio, Indiana, Illinols, Michigan and France - in excess of 722,000 Legionnaires.

If elected, I will work tirelessly with the Membership Chairman to implement a Three R Program to help continue the growth of the SAR. We added about 2,000 members under President General Leishman and closed his year with about 31,000 members. I expect similar growth during PG Dooley's term and my goal will be to add to that in 2014-15.



CALIFORNIA SOCIETY SONS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION Fall Board of Managers Meeting November 1-2, 2013

November 1st

SESSION I

The meeting was opened by President Stephen Hurst at 9:17am. The Color Guard led by Commander James C. Fosdyck presented the colors. The invocation was given by the Rev. Louis V. Carlson. The Pledge to the Flag was led by Bob Ebert. The SAR Pledge was led by Jim Faulkinbury.

The roll call was taken (Exhibit A) by Secretary Douglas Bergtholdt. A quorum was established. National officers in attendance were introduced. They included; Former President General Larry Magerkurth, President General Joe Dooley, Secretary General Lindsey Brock, Registrar General J. Michael Tomme, Chancellor General John Dodd, Genealogist General Larry Cornwell, Chaplain General Lou Carlson, Vice-President General of the Western District Bob Ebert, and Former Historian General Charles Lampman.

President Hurst then introduced the Past Presidents of the State Society in attendance. They were; Keith Bigbee, John Dodd, Lou Carlson, Karl Jacobs, Charles Lampman, Stephen Renouf, Larry Magerkurth and Bob Ebert.

The minutes from the April meeting had been emailed out. It was moved and seconded that they be accepted as written. With no discussion the motion passed.

OFFICER REPORTS

President Hurst noted that he attended the new Yosemite Chapter.

Executive Vice-President Jim Faulkinbury reported that he had attended several chapter meetings; Mother Lode, Redwood and Yosemite.

Vice-President North Ron Barker reported that he attended the Congress in Kansas City as well as the chapter meetings of the Gold, Sacramento, San Francisco, Redding and Yosemite Chapters.

Vice-President South Kent Gregory reported that he had fun visiting chapters and enjoyed speaking to them. Those visited included; Orange County, Redlands, Harbor, General George S. Patton, Sons of Liberty Santa Barbara and Coachella Chapters. He attended a Flag Day celebration and Congress.

Vice-President of Membership Phil Hinshaw reported that we had 2 new chapters; Yosemite and Eagle Chapters. He attended the inaugural Yosemite Chapter meeting. He spoke to the Eagle Chapter on Membership. He had 12 inquiries that he forwarded to the chapter. They will keep him advised on the progress of these prospective members.

Secretary Doug Bergtholdt reported that he attended Congress and is the State Contact person and made referrals to the chapter registrars and gave out the websites for further information on the chapter the perspectives were interested in. He handled all new member packets and all new supplemental packets.

Treasurer was absent. No report at this time.

Registrar Owen Stiles reported (**Exhibit B**) that he processed 222 applications so far this year. That included 183 new applications, 20 supplementals and 19 junior members. There are currently 49 applications at National, 11 supplementals and 13 pended applications which need further documentation. He thanked the chapter Registrars for doing a good job on the applications.

Chancellor was absent. No report at this time.

Genealogist Terry Briggs reported that he replied to all inquiries. There were 68 referrals from DAR. He reviewed the pended applications. Old applications that had been pended for a long time were removed. There were 11 from National that were returned to the chapters. After 3 years they cannot be acted on by National, National will either shred these applications or return them to the chapter. We need to reduce the number of pended applications.

Historian Jim Blauer reported that his report was the minutes from the previous meeting and that they had been approved by the state earlier.

Investment Trustee Stephen Renouf said the Investment Committee will meet later and report later to the members.

Budget Chairman Jim Faulkinbury reported that the committee would meet later. No report at this time.

California Compatriot Editor Jim Faulkinbury reported that the Summer Issue had been mailed out. Printed copies are now \$5.00 for two issues. A special edition was sent out recently with information on Congress and the Fall Trustees Meeting in Louisville. The cost for the last issue was \$2200. The 2013 budget included sufficient funds to setup, print, and mail the Winter 2013 issue. The Spring 2013 issue of the Compatriot was sent to all members, and there was a setup for the special Congress edition which would be online only. The Winter 2014 issue will be produced in January and comes out of the 2014 budget. It cost the budged \$300 for the setup leaving \$600 for the setup of the remaining two issues. Only had 21 members opted to receive the Compatriot by USPS delivery which should have put \$105 of actual income into the new line item for subscription income (Jim Faulkinbury has not received verification of this but Secretary Bergtholdt provided the list of subscribers that I used for the mailing). Jim used \$35 for the mailing of the Winter 2014 edition leaving \$70 for the mailing of the Spring edition.

Regarding the \$40 expense for the special Congress edition which came out of the 2013 budget, since I was able to put most of the setup together myself and only needed a couple of pages to be setup by the company we use for that purpose, they only charged \$40 rather than the \$300 allocated for that issue.

The <u>2014</u> budget included a new line item of \$1000 for subscription income which would be used as the offset for the <u>printing a mailing</u> of an estimated 200 subscribers for the Compatriot. The 2014 budget also reduced the expense line item for the Compatriot to \$900 which is used to pay for the setup of 3 issues through the company that we've used for the last several issues (they create a final PDF for putting the issue online, or for submission to a printing/mailing facility for those who subscribe). The 2014 budget also established a new expense line item to pass-through the subscription income received.

CAR Chairman Brian Stephens reported there are 26 Societies here in California. We have 26 chapters, one for each society. The State President and Senior President will be in attendance tomorrow.

Chapter Activity Contest Chairman Phil Hinshaw reported that only 11 of the 26 chapters, less than half participate in the contest this year. He finds this disappointing. He noted that one chapter has over 5,000 points. There are 5 chapter groups according to size and there are 8 categories in which to earn points from the chapter's activities. There will be changes in 2014 with new items added for points. He hopes more chapters will participate next year. The new score sheets and rules will be sent out by the end of the year.

Protocol Chairman and Commander Jim Fosdyck had nothing to report on protocol, but noted on the Color Guard front Larry wood had proposed that the Let Freedom Ring ceremony conducted throughout the country on the fourth of July should be made a National event. It was approved at Congress and is now a National event.

Compliance Chairman Karl Jacobs was absent. It was noted that chapters need to file their 990N forms to be in compliance.

DAR Chairman absent. No report.

Ethics Chairman absent. No report.

Flag Chairman absent. No report.

Information Technology Chairman absent. No report.

Medals & Awards Chairman Kent Gregory reported income from the sale of medals was \$1011. That includes the \$260 from the sale of the California Medal. That supply is down to 15 sets.

Nomination Liaison Keith Bigbee reports he is to meet this afternoon to work on the slate of officers for 2014.

Congress Planning Chairman John Dodd reported that we will be hosting the 2019 Congress. There will be a presentation at the Spring meeting on this. He asks that anyone who wishes to help out it would be greatly appreciated. To put on a Congress is a massive undertaking and will need a lot of volunteers

This matches up nicely with the state curriculum. Several schools in the state are using this book.

Poster Contest Chairman David Gilliard was absent. Ron Barker asked that chapters get involved in this contest. This year's theme will be "Francis Marion, the Swamp Fox".

Eagle Scout Chairman Gary Jensen reported he needs the contact information of the chapter Eagle Scout Chairman. He has a handout for each chapter. He also noted the Robert E. Burt Boy Scout Volunteer Award for members who have been involved with their local scouting council.

Essay Contest Chairman Kent Gregory reported that there were 160 essays submitted to the various chapters from 26 high schools. There were 12 chapters participating in this contest. John Dodd reported **on by-law #23**(National). This amendment has to do with finances. It is to be voted on at Congress. This will not only help to bring our financing into alignment but will also assist in complying with the law. This will create an investment policy. If ratified the allocation of investments in by-laws will change where by financial officers and committees will make the investments. It was moved by Bob Falagly that we accept this. It was seconded by Owen Stiles. There was no discussion and the motion passed to support this amendment.

The budget was discussed. A copy (Exhibit M) was handed out to the members and specific items were mentioned. Item I-26 has to do with the new subscription for the California Compatriot. C-45 deals with the expenses in printing and mailing the Compatriot. It was reduced from \$2400 to \$900. Vice-President Membership was reduced from \$2,250 to \$1,950. A \$300 reduction. Under A-08 the

Registrar's budget has been increased to \$500. The ROTC/JROTC awards was increased \$130 from \$1520 to \$1650 to help cover the expense of 10 Sea Cadet Units in the state. \$250 was added to the Flag Certificate program. It went from \$250 to \$500. Officer insurance will run a couple hundred dollars. They expect a \$1600 surplus at this time. It was moved that we accept this report by Ron Barker and seconded by Keith Bigbee. There was no discussion and the motion passed.

Jim Faulkinbury asked that we take \$750 of the surplus and place it towards the President General's initiatives. This was moved by Lou Carlson and seconded by Steve Renouf. All or part of the remainder may be used for a donation to the Center. With no discussion from the floor the motion passed.

Tom Adams reported that a\$100 donation was made to the CAR State Society to replace their flag poles for their Convention. This came from B-34. The CAR State President Macon McIntyre reported that this year's project is Boxes for the Bravest. These are care packages sent overseas to our military. There were flyers on the back table. They also have pins for sale. 1 for \$12 and 2 for \$20.

Monterey Chapter reported that they have a speakers Bureau list on their website. It was suggested that our California Webmaster place these chapter lists on the state website.

Jim Faulkinbury reported that the Spring meeting will be at the Embassy Suites in Sacramento.

PG Joe Dooley reported he had booklets on the Constitution and the Declaration of Independence for \$1.00 each.

PG Dooley also took a few minutes to talk about his PG initiatives.

- 1) Challenge each state society that if they donate \$400 to the center he will kick in \$100 to make it a \$500 from the State. If they donate \$750 he will kick in a \$250 donation to make it a \$1,000 donation from the state.
- 2) The Ladies Mount Vernon Association has a project where if the members, chapters or State societies can find a school willing to accept a portrait of George Washington and display it in a prominent place. A donation of just \$250 can make it a reality. With this the state will get a streamer for its flag pole.
- 3) If your chapter or state has a marker, monument or memorial put in place, make sure it has a reference to SAR.
- 4) If the state or chapter makes a \$250 donation to the USO in cash or goods, they will receive a streamer for their flagpole.
- 5) President General Dooley also noted the need for the retention of members. They will take the number of members in the state on December 31st and the number from January 31st. If at 95% or better in their retention the state will get a streamer.
- 6) They are beginning the Vietnam Veterans Recognition and expansion of the original program from WWII to Korean and now Vietnam. Col. Chuck Sweeney of the Florida Society is spearheading this recognition and there were 140 recognized at the Fall Trustees Meeting.

With no further business it was moved by Lou Carlson that we adjourn. This was seconded and the motion passed.

Kent Gregory led the reciting of the recessional.

Notes to Income Statement:

Revenues are accounted for as pre-investment transfers and post-investment transfers. Pre-investment transfers are all receipts from members, interest and donations. These are then supplemented with transfers from the investment account pertaining to Life Member CASSAR fees, NSSAR Life Member Fees and State Chapter Life Member fees. The NSSAR Life Member and regular member fees, and the State Chapter Life Member fees are pass-throughs. These amounts are submitted to NSSAR and the State Chapters (see Operating Expenses). For tax reporting purposes, the transfer fees are not considered income but are, instead, transfers from the investment accounts to checking.

Transfer from Education Fund - \$4,498 was budgeted to be transferred. It was determined later in the year that the by laws pertaining to the Education Fund precluded the transfer of amounts in excess of the interest received from the San Diego Fund in the year. Since these funds were not needed for 2013, it was decided not to transfer any funds.

Expenses:

Officer Expenses – typically fall below budget. Many of the expenses incurred by officers are not requested for reimbursement. Typical requests for out-of-pocket reimbursements include postage and supplies.

Committee Expenses -

- Expenses total operating expenses are below budget by \$8,095. Most expenses
 are incurred during the first four months of the year when the Spring BOM meeting
 is held, and during the last quarter of the year after the Fall BOM meeting. Major
 contributors to the positive variance are:
 - a. Executive Secretary and VP Membership expenses were below budget by \$3,778.
 - b. Board of Managers President General Expense was below budget by \$1,900.
 - c. Annual Dues to NSSAR were below budget by \$2,260 due to a lower than expected membership count.
 - d. Other Expenses, which is a cushion expense account, was below budget by \$1,119.
- 2. Negative variance to the budget was in costs of the Compatriot News Letter, \$1,310. (See News Letter Committee report)
