On Saturday, September 12, 2020, Deputy Apolinar and her partner, Deputy Emmanuel Perez- Perez were parked outside the Metro Blue Line Station in Compton. An unknown suspect walked up to the passenger side of their patrol vehicle and fired multiple rounds through the window, striking Deputy Apolinar in the jaw and arms, and her partner Deputy Perez-Perez was struck in the forehead, arm, and hand.

Ignoring her own wounds, Deputy Apolinar, assisted Deputy Perez-Perez to a place of safety, and she applied a tourniquet to his wounds. She also put out a call for help even though she had a shattered jaw and was experiencing excruciating pain.

Throughout the incident, Deputy Apolinar remained calm and stayed vigilant. Most of all she never gave up. Deputy Perez's fight to survive and tactical skills are a credit to the law enforcement community.

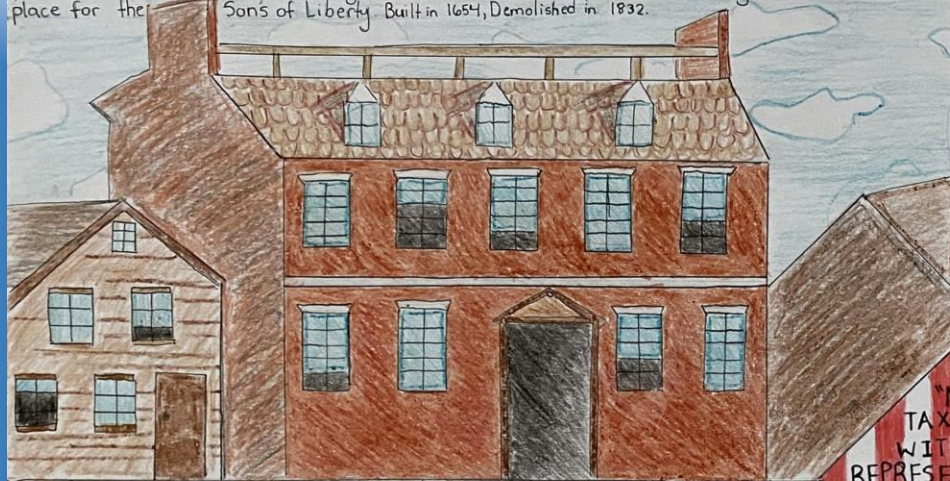

They held important meetings there where they planned events. The Green Dragon Tavern was an important meeting place for the Sons of Liberty. Built in 1654, Demolished in 1832.

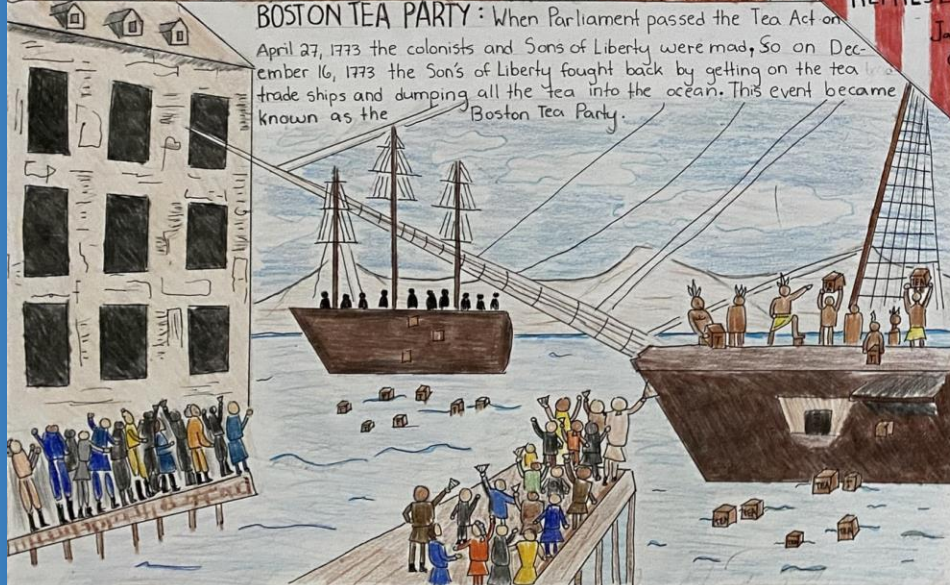

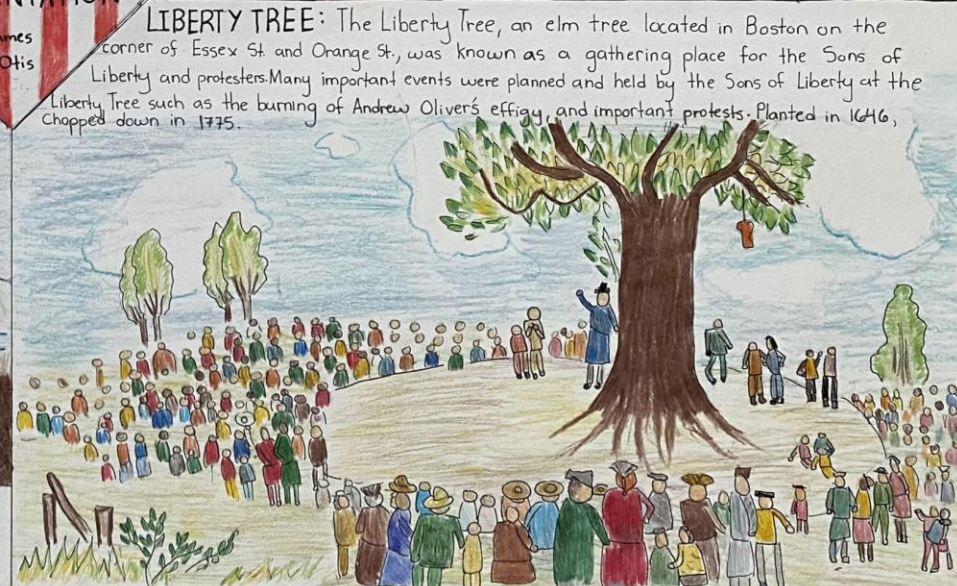

BOSTON TEA PARTY: When Parliament passed the Tea Act on April 27, 1773 the colonists and Sons of Liberty were mad, so on December 16, 1773 the Sons of Liberty fought back by getting on the tea trade ships and dumping all the tea into the ocean. This event became known as the Boston Tea Party.



LIBERTY TREE: The Liberty Tree, an elm tree located in Boston on the corner of Essex St and Orange St, was known as a gathering place for the Sons of Liberty and protesters. Many important events were planned and held by the Sons of Liberty at the Liberty Tree such as the burning of Andrew Oliver's effigy, and important protests. Planted in 1646, Chopped down in 1775.



SONS OF LIBERTY

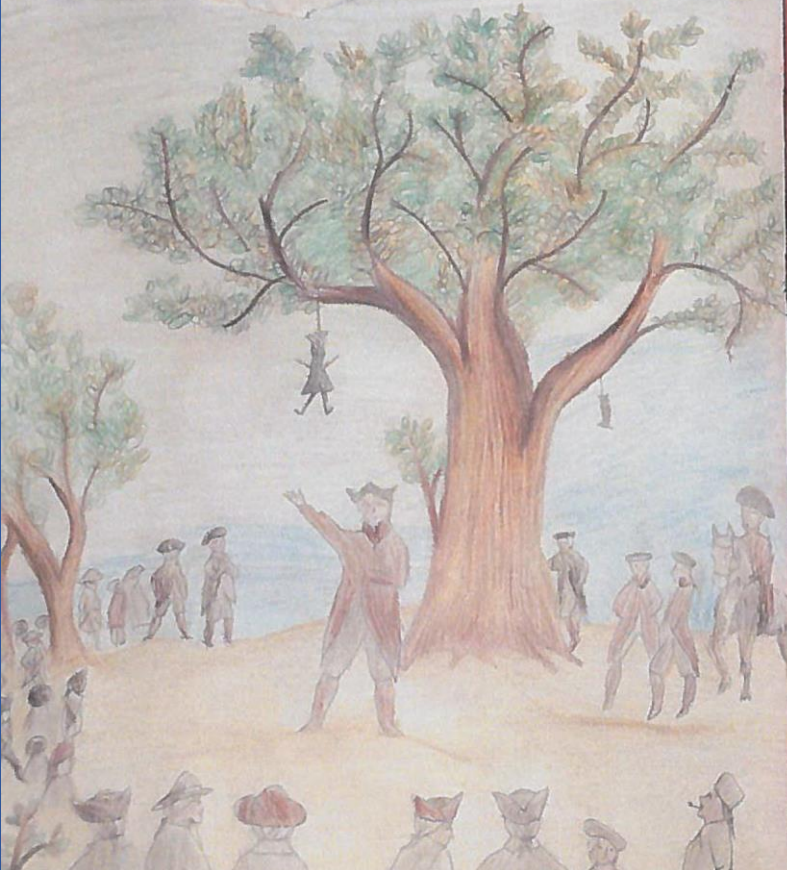
The Sons of Liberty was a group of workers, artisans, and tradesmen. The group was founded in August 1765. The Sons of Liberty fought for "No taxation without representation," fairness for the colonists, freedom from England, and a say in the taxes that Parliament was making. One important event the Sons of Liberty participated in was the burning of Andrew Oliver's property and effigy. The reason for this event was to fight against the Stamp Act. Another event the Sons of Liberty participated in was the Boston Tea Party on December 16, 1773. The reason for the Boston Tea Party was to protest the fact that they had no representation in the making of the Tea Act. Two important meeting places for the Sons of Liberty were the Green Dragon Tavern and the Liberty Tree. There they planned important events, and held meetings. The Sons of Liberty was a big group of colonists who fought for representation in the making of the tax. Parliament was enforcing on them, and liberty.

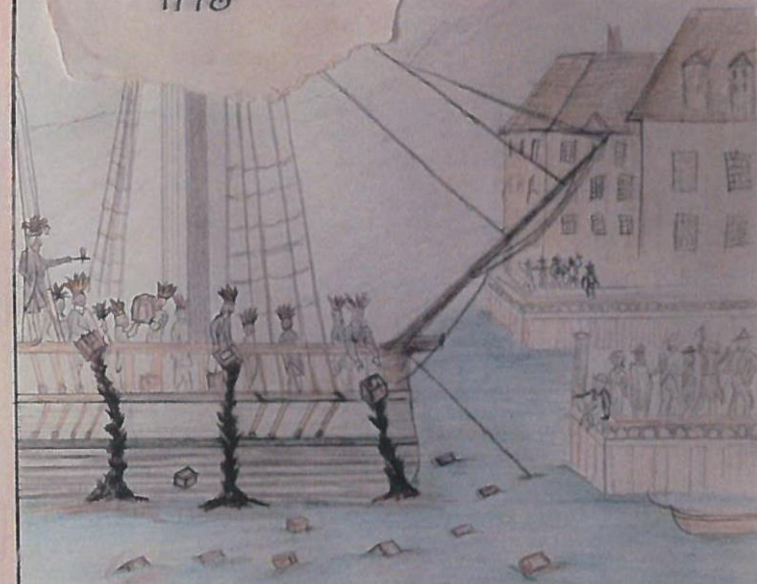

The Liberty Tree was a famous Elm Tree that stood in Boston. In 1765, colonists gathered at the tree and staged the first act of defiance against British rule. 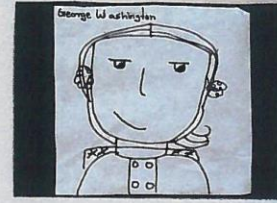

Fun Facts

- The name "Sons of Liberty" came from a speech that Isaac Barre, a member of the British Parliament, gave to the rest of the Parliament in February of 1765.
- Abigail Adams, wife of John Adams and a daughter of liberty, famously asked her husband to please "remember the ladies" in her letters to him. She was one of the first women to speak up for women's rights. Abigail hoped her husband would remember the ladies when he was writing the new countries important foundational documents.

Sons and Daughters of Liberty

Have you ever been a part of a secret club? A famous, well known club was called "the sons and daughters of liberty". The secret group was formed in 1765, all the members in the group were known for being a patriot. Most colonist did not like the Stamp Act, the sons of liberty took it a step further by organizing the protest in response to the act. The daughters of liberty were also passionate Patriots. These women helped support the sons of liberty by spreading the word about ways to protect British goods. A memorable act of the sons of liberty took place August 14, 1765. The sons of liberty hung a sculpture of Andrew Oliver, the city stamp tax agent, in Boston. The models head was cut off, stomped on, and burned. Many of the British officials whom were supposed to be enforcing the stamp act had gone into hiding because they were scared of the sons of liberty. On March 1, 1766 the stamp act was repealed, or canceled.
